



# TRAFFIC CONTROL PERSON (TCP)

## Course Format – ½ Day

This course was developed by a Provincial Committee with representatives from the Department of Transportation, WorkSafeNB (formerly WHSCC), Safety Services New Brunswick and Industry.

Candidates are required to pass a written/oral Qualification Test (80%) demonstrating their knowledge and skills in stopping, slowing and directing traffic. Candidates will also be required to complete a three-day internship demonstrating the skills of Signalling. Maximum number of participants per session – 15.

## Course Objectives

The course objectives are three fold: to teach and train the traffic control person in the proper methods and techniques of stopping, slowing and directing traffic; to make participants aware of the potential results of poor traffic control procedures including death and injuries to the traveling public, fellow workers and themselves; and thirdly, to reduce the possibility of damage to equipment, vehicles and materials.
